THURLLOW CHURCH OF ENGLAND (VC) PRIMARY SCHOOL

The school dates back to 1967 and has been extended with additional classrooms as the school grew. The school has worked in partnership with Hundon Community Primary School since 2014 when the two schools formally federated.

The two schools work collaboratively, 'pooling' their resources, sharing expertise, including leadership and the Governing Body. Together, the two schools provide the children with a wide range of shared learning experiences, including trips and visits, events and visitors as well as opportunities for staff to work together, sharing best pedagogy and practise.

The school itself is centrally situated within the lively village of Thurlow and consists of two distinct buildings. One, resembling a forest lodge is primarily for our youngest pupils, is fully self-contained and has direct access to an allocated 'wilderness' area. Alongside sits our main building which has four airy classrooms, each with cloakroom areas and a library. All are located around our large central hall which sits at the heart of our school. Our hall is suitable for a variety of social and recreational and frequently used for Collective Worship (assemblies,) P.E sessions, concerts and collaborative activities as well as school lunch.

We have a hard play area complete with engaging playground markings for games and activities, physical and imaginative play areas, a trim trail, a large grass area for sports and enclosed outdoor learning areas for Early Years and Key Stage One pupils. We also have an outdoor swimming pool which the youngest pupils within our Federation benefit from the use of, in the summer months.

There are Headteacher and Administration offices, a staff room and a well-equipped, fully functioning kitchen where our school meals are prepared, fresh, every day, from scratch.

As a Church of England school we regularly visit the Thurlow church of St Peter to gather together with our families, for example, for harvest and Christingle. We also make full use of the community resources including the village hall for sports, gymnastics, dance and drama learning.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

Hundon and Thurlow Primary Federation and the two schools therein positively encourage equality of opportunity with regards gender, age, race, disability, religion or belief, sexual orientation, gender reassignment, pregnancy or maternity and any other recognised area of discrimination.

The schools within our Federation seek to reflect this within the organisation, staffing, pastoral and social responsibilities.

OUR CURRICULUM

As a staff we have considered carefully our Federation Curriculum to ensure it meets the needs of our specific school communities as well as fulfilling the requirements of the National Curriculum. We want our children to leave our schools happy and confident with a bank of essential knowledge and skills which support them in being motivated, independent and successful learners, ready for their next stage of education.



Our Federation Curriculum is delivered through a considered mix of discrete subjects and 'themed' learning which integrates foundation subjects within our overarching themes. Our themes have been designed to complement and build on one another with links and progression so that skills and concepts can be developed and understood more deeply and knowledge applied in different, more challenging contexts.

Our long-term plans are adjusted to ensure our bespoke, personalised provision challenges our more-able pupils, whilst those finding particular elements more difficult, are appropriately supported so they too experience success.



Our Federation Curriculum is underpinned by our core values. These are interwoven as well as explicitly taught through our PSHEE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education) and BRAVE (Beliefs, Religions and Values Education,) placing our children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural development and their understanding of the core values of our society 'front and centre'.

This is further enhanced by our themed days, whole school activities and opportunities within and outside school. After school clubs and events extend these opportunities further.

Our outdoor environments have been developed to enrich different areas of the curriculum, for example, reading, PE, Science and local community facilities are utilised for active learning for all our children.

Our children have opportunities to share their learning, with their adults, with each other, their parents and carers and within our Federation through school-based and external exhibitions, performances, competitions and events involving other schools.

SPORTS

We teach PE, dance and swimming in line with the National Curriculum. All children will participate in gymnastics, team games and other sports activities. A variety of sports clubs are run after school during the year.

THE ARTS

Your child will experience a range of provisions. Each child is taught Art, Dance and Music as part of the curriculum and sometimes will be involved in visits to galleries, working with musicians, taking part in concerts and productions and working with professional artists.

BRAVE ~ BELIEFS, RELIGIONS AND VALUES EDUCATION & COLLECTIVE WORSHIP (RELIGIOUS EDUCATION ~ RE)

In this school, collective worship and religious education are taught in accordance with the Church of England faith. As an Anglian Christian school, two thirds of our BRAVE lessons are Christianity based and use Suffolk's Emmanuelle Project. We also learn about other faiths and our curriculum focuses on the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of the individual.

Parents wishing to withdraw their child from RE and collective worship have a right to do so and are invited to speak to the Headteacher on this matter. Any request to withdraw your child from RE lessons must be put in writing.



RELATIONSHIPS, SEX AND HEALTH EDUCATION

After careful consideration, the governors of the school have approved the offer of a programme of sex education as part of the curriculum which fully covers the RSHE requirements set out by the government. This is appropriate to the children's age and experience and will be presented within a moral, family-orientated Christian framework. Sex education is addressed in our Science, BRAVE and PSHEE education programmes.

We aim to help children understand themselves and others, to make successful friendships and relationships; to appreciate and respect individuals, regardless of race, colour, creed or gender, and to understand that humans have different beliefs, values and customs. We believe that at the centre of relationships is the development of self-esteem and wellbeing. By exploring these ideas, we hope the children will be helped to form meaningful relationships and to make valued judgements in adult life.

A Relationships, Sex and Health Education Policy has been agreed with governors and is available in school or on our website.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

We are an inclusive school and our aim is to ensure that all children succeed. Drawing on our ethos as well as our Christian values, including perseverance, respect and compassion, all children are encouraged to play an active part in all aspects of school life.

We recognise that some children need more support than others to help them achieve, Some difficulties are short term and some may be long term. We work closely with parents and carers to monitor progress and meet the child's needs.

Support may be provided by the Class Teacher by planning work at different levels or by a Learning Support Assistant working with the child in a small group or individually.

The Federation has a special needs policy and we keep up to date records of children with special education needs in school.

Please contact us if you would like more detail regarding arrangements for special needs and gifted and talented children. Detailed information is available on our website.

PUPILS WITH DISABILITIES

The school is accessible for children with disabilities. The school building is on one level and wheelchair accessible. When a child has particular needs, we take all necessary steps to meet these and ensure all pupils have full access to the curriculum. We have an equality policy and plan which includes provision for children with disabilities.

SAFEGUARDING

Our Federation and the schools therein maintain an ethos where our pupils feel secure, are encouraged to talk and are listened to. Children at our schools will be able to talk freely to any member of staff, or regular visitor to our school, if they are worried or concerned about something.

All staff and regular visitors will either, through training or induction, know how to recognise a disclosure from a child and will know how to manage this.

At all times, we will work in partnership and endeavour to establish effective working relationships with parents, carers and colleagues from other agencies. We have a legal responsibility to report suspected abuse of whatever kind and also signs that could be indicators of abuse. This includes keeping children safe online. We take this responsibility seriously even though it can unfortunately cause bad feelings on occasions. Our responsibility is to the children.

PARENTAL PARTNERSHIP

We want to work in partnership with all parents and carers so that your child is happy and successful in school. We ask all parents to sign a partnership agreement when their child starts at Thurlow Church of England (VC) Primary School. This sets out what you can expect from us and what we expect from you and your child.

Parents are welcome to chat with Class Teachers informally at the end of the school day or make appointments if necessary. In addition, Parent Consultation sessions are held with parents to discuss their child's progress, and keep them informed about the curriculum.

If at any time you are worried or concerned about your child's progress, please see the Class Teacher in the first instance and then the Headteacher if the problem is unresolved.

BEHAVIOUR

We expect all children to behave sensibly, to respect adults, each other and the school environment. We keep our rules to a minimum; they are made only to ensure the well-being and safety of all children in our care. They are discussed regularly with the children and linked to our Christian values, including, forgiveness, compassion and truthfulness. Parents are kept informed of problems if they do arise and are asked to co-operate fully in rectifying any difficulties. All incidents of poor behaviour are recorded to enable us to monitor over time.

Children are children and sometimes forget what we expect of them. We remind them in various ways, depending on how serious their actions have been. For serious misbehaviour, e.g. fighting, the Class Teacher will talk to you. If the behaviour persists, you may be asked to come in to talk about how we can work together to address the problem. We rarely exclude children from school and are committed to inclusion. In the rare cases where such a step is necessary we follow exclusion procedures.

If you have worries about your child in school, please come in and talk to the Class Teacher or make an appointment to see the Headteacher. Don't wait for the worry to become a major concern!

ADMISSIONS

We admit children in line with the Suffolk LA Admissions Policy. Children will be offered a full-time Reception place at the beginning of the academic year in which they have their fifth birthday. All entrants must make an admission application, **the website address for online admissions is:** www.suffolk.gov.uk/onlineadmissions

The school serves the village of Thurlow as well as the surrounding locality, including the town of Haverhill. Parents are welcome to make an application regardless of where they live and are positively encouraged to contact the school to make an appointment to visit.

As part of admission to our Reception class we offer a comprehensive range of activities to support this step, including pre-school setting visits, home visits, 'taster' sessions as well as a detailed parent information session around June in the summer term. (Our Early Years Teaching Team liaise with all pre-school settings within our locality of which there are several.)

At the parent information session we share more information about what life is like at our school and specifically for our Reception children. Our highly experienced Early Years Teaching Team will be available to answer any questions as well as talk about what your child will learn and how we approach learning with our youngest children. We also offer suggestions to help you prepare your child for school and support them when they start.

WRAP AROUND CARE

We endeavour to support working families by offering a daily morning sports club. This runs from 8am Monday to Friday and is free. Places are limited and allocated on a first come, first served basis with priority given to working parents and those in receipt of pupil premium funding. We also offer free sports clubs after-school on various days which run until 4.15pm; these are dependent on uptake and interest. Currently we have football immediately after-school on a Wednesday.

For working families with additional childcare requirements we recommend 'Happy Days Childcare' which is located a mere 8 minutes from us, just off the A143 and provides wrap-around-care provision from 7am in the morning until 6.30pm in the evening, Monday to Friday. Happy Days also provide transport to and from our school as required. More information can be found here:

COLLABORATIVE WORKING

Thurlow Church of England (VC) Primary School is dedicated to providing the best educational experiences and securing the highest standards for our children to ensure they achieve their fullest potential, whatever their backgrounds, skills and capabilities.

We believe a love of learning must be nurtured from a very young age and the phases of education should be seamlessly linked to secure continuity, progression and high standards. We do this in partnership with parents and carers but also in collaboration with our colleagues from across all phases of learning.

We spend time with our pre-school settings, sharing good practice and visiting our 'soon to be' pupils regularly, and particularly in the summer term, when we talk with staff and parents to ensure a smooth start to their time in school is achieved.

In addition we have strong communication links with our foremost secondary schools, Samuel Ward Academy and Castle Manor Academy within the Unity Partnership in Haverhill, Linton Village College and others, including Stour Valley Community Academy in Clare and further afield into Cambridge. Our Year 6 pupils undertake a robust programme of transition activities which helps to ensure our pupils continue to build on their learning journey as successful learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens.

Like us, our self-governing primary school colleagues within the towns of Haverhill, Newmarket and further afield share our desire to ensure the best possible outcomes for all children within our communities. To this end we work closely with other primary schools, for example, New Cangle Primary School, Exning Primary School and Elveden Primary Academy on mutual areas for development and share our expertise.

STAFFING AND ORGANISATION

We are fortunate to have a highly qualified, skilled and talented team of teachers, assistants, administrators and other support staff. With our small numbers and to support our work in addressing the impact of the pandemic on the last two years, our children are currently grouped as follows:

In each class the teaching and learning is personalised to meet the needs of all children. Throughout the day children will be engaged in individual, paired, small group and whole class tasks and activities.

TIME KEEPING AND ATTENDANCE

At Thurlow Church of England (VC) Primary School we want all children to learn the value of good time keeping. The children have full days of activities. If they are late, they miss part of the curriculum. This time is never made up and persistent lateness will affect your child's progress in school. Help your child to learn the useful habit of arriving on time. This will help them in school and later on in life.

We need your child to come to school every day unless they are ill. If they are too ill to come to school, please telephone us by 9.30am. If we do not have any explanation of a child's absence, we mark this as unauthorised, which is known as truancy.

Parents may be issued with a penalty notice if their child has 8 unauthorised absences. One day equates to 2 sessions. If your child's attendance falls below 90%, they are considered to be a 'persistent absentee' and we will ask you to come into school to discuss the matter. Please also let us know if your child has a medical or dental appointment.

COLLECTING CHILDREN

Please collect your child at the end of the day from the Class Teacher at the designated place (playground). Always contact us if you are unavoidably delayed or if someone else will be collecting your child. Your children are precious, we will not hand them over to anyone else unless you have informed us. Children who are not collected on time may become frightened or upset so please let us know if you are going to be delayed. Older children may make their own way home, providing parents have given written permission.

UNIFORM

We believe that our school uniform is smart, wears well and contributes to a sense of belonging. The majority of items can be bought from a variety of shops and supermarkets at a reasonable price and our official school jumper / cardigan can be purchased from Brigade and School Trends.

If any parents do have any difficulties, then please contact the school for support and guidance.

Items of good quality, second hand uniform are often available for a small donation from the office. Please ask our Administration staff for more information.

Our uniform consists of

- Royal blue sweatshirt, jumper, fleece or cardigan
- Grey or black trousers, skirt, shorts or dress
- White shirt / polo shirt
- Royal blue / gold tie (in stock at school)
- Summer option: Blue checked dress
- Plain socks / tights (blue, grey, black, white)
- Suitable black outdoor footwear*
- Sunhats in summer

*When the weather is particularly warm we suggest the children wear flat, closed toe sandals for comfort.

PE KIT consists of

- Royal blue shorts with elasticated waist (no zips please)
- Official Thurlow PE shirt / plain T-shirt in white (no buttons or zips please)
- Trainers
- Plain tracksuit bottom and top (in winter / if cold)

Uniform with the school logo are available from Brigade and School Trends

Remember to mark any clothing with names. The schools cannot accept any responsibility for misplaced clothing but, if clothing is clearly marked, will make every effort to see lost items returned.

Jewellery should not be worn. Only stud earrings may be worn for school and must be removed for all PE in accordance with the recommendations of the Department for Education.

Swimming is part of the curriculum and will require a one-piece swimsuit or swim shorts and a towel in a waterproof bag.

COMPLAINTS

We hope that you never need to complain but if you do, please follow the procedure below in the order it is set out.

1. Talk to your child's teacher. If the matter is unresolved, please put it in writing and address it to the Headteacher.
2. The Headteacher will arrange to meet with you to discuss the matter. Hopefully, it will be resolved. If it isn't, you will be asked to put the matter in writing to the Chair of Governors who will investigate the matter thoroughly.

3. As a last resort, and only if all other channels have been exhausted, the matter may be referred to the Department for Education who will work with the Governing Body to resolve the issue.

A full copy of the complaints procedure is available in school and on the website.

SEVERE WEATHER

Every effort will be made to keep the school open in severe weather. The school will only close if it is no longer safe for staff and pupils to travel to school and be on site.

We recognise that it is important that our school remains open so parents are able to work and pupils can continue to learn. Therefore, we will make every effort to prepare for severe weather.

Our school website will also be updated to show if the school is closed.

SCHOOL MEALS

You can choose for your child/ren to have our school meals at lunchtime, be it through choice, the government's 'universal free school meal' offer for children in Reception through to Year 2 or entitlement due to eligibility for Pupil Premium Funding.

Unlike many primary schools nationally of our size, we are fortunate to have our own well-equipped, fully functioning kitchen where Jen, our Cook, from EATS catering, prepares our meals fresh, every day, from scratch. Jen is brilliant and always endeavours to ensure all the children having school meals are fully catered for, accommodating dietary requirements and individual preferences as much as she can.

Our menus and the meals therein are handcrafted and regularly updated to take into account freshness and seasonality. The meals are made using ethically sourced ingredients from local suppliers and are in line with the 'School Food Standards' and 'Food for Life' guidelines so you can be assured your child will be enjoying two tasty, nutritiously balanced courses whilst they are at school.

EATS are also committed to increasing children's intake of fruit and vegetable so always ensure there are a minimum of six varieties of vegetables and salads available across a week and reducing sugar and fat in their menus so often use natural sweetness from things like beetroot and parsnips in their desserts!

We currently have a two-week rota and our weekly roast is on a Wednesday. Remember children can opt to have school meals on particular days linked to the menu. The cost of a school meal in Years 3 to 6 is £2.30 (a week is £11.50.) All meals **MUST** be paid for in advance. Payment is required online where a minimum of five meals must be purchased at any one time.

CHARGING POLICY

During their time in school, your child will be involved in a range of outside activities during the school day e.g. visits to a museum or theatre. In such circumstances we will inform you first and seek your permission, we may also ask for a contribution from you to support us in paying for the visit. In doing so, we will not seek to disqualify anyone from taking part.

WALKING VISITS IN OUR LOCALITY

Children are sometimes taken on walking visits within the village as part of the curriculum. We ask that all parents sign the allocated permission slip when their child starts at the school.

PHOTOGRAPHY

There may be times when children are photographed or videoed as part of normal school activities. Any parent who does not wish their child to be photographed in this way is asked to make their wishes known to the school using the consent form.
